Aims & Objectives:	To develop key skills through the experience of work.Insight into working in agriculture	
Key Tasks:	Students must be prepared to do quite a lot of observation/shadowing of the trained farm staff, then after training and under supervision (at all times) students may be able to assist staff with simple duties around the farm such as - milking the cows, helping in the cowsheds, general maintenance and repairs around the farm, cleaning and tidying up and feeding the animals.	
Requirements:	Should have common sense, confidence and initiative with a genuine interest in farming. Should not be afraid of hard work.	
Clothing:	Dress should be older, tidy, casual clothes. Wellington boots are essential!Please take outdoor and wet weather clothing.	
Working Hours:	6-11, 2.30 - 6.00 Monday to Friday (max 37 hours total in week) Discuss at interview	
Meal Breaks:	1 and a half hours for lunch which may be taken off site if preferred. If remaining on farm a packed lunch will be needed.

LIFTING & MANUAL HANDING:-Safe manual handling to be shown as required - students must not lift beyond their capabilities nothing over 20 kilos.PERSONAL PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT:-Rubber gloves to be provided and worn if student assists with sterilising milking equipment.
