Aims & Objectives: To develop key skills through the experience of work.
To gain an insight into working in sea fisheries. .

Key Tasks: Student will do a certain amount of observation then with training and under supervision may do simple tasks. These may include spending time within the various sections of sea fisheries. A programme will be prepared that may include spending time with the following people:
Marine scientist surveying sea bed. Technical officer collating facts and figures for sea fisheries.
A visit to a fresh fish provider such as Sea fresh. Licensing department issuing fishing licenses to commercial fishermen. A visit to the Leopardess boat (in harbour) this is weather dependent.
This placement will give students the opportunity to find out about marine biology in Guernsey and fisheries protection

Requirements: A genuine desire to learn about marine biology and fisheries protection. Common sense. An interest in science and intention to study sciences. Cheerful and not afraid to ask questions.

Clothing: Warm, smart casual clothes. Waterproofs will be provided. Deck shoes or trainers for visiting the harbour, smart (school type) shoes for the rest of the time.

Working Hours: Monday Friday (ONLY 2 DAYS TO BE AGREED BEFORE PLACEMENT.) 10am 4pm

Meal Breaks: Bring own lunch.30 minutes minimum
