Updated results process for BTECs: *19th August 2020

Following Ofqual's announcement that A-Level and GCSE students are to receive Centre Assessment Grades, Pearson (the body which administers BTEC) qualifications has decided to apply Ofqual's principles for students receiving BTECs this summer. This means Centre Assessment Grades will apply across all teacher assessed internal units and examined grades that students were unable to sit.

Pearson will be regrading all the following BTECs- BTEC Level 3 Nationals (2010 QCF and 2016 RQF), BTEC Level 1/2 Tech Awards, BTEC Level 2 Technicals and BTEC Level 1/2 Firsts. Pearson are reassuring students that no grades will go down as part of this review.

Pearson have asked Schools and Colleges not to issue any BTEC Level 1 & 2 results on the 20th August as these will be reviewed and where appropriate regraded. https://www.pearson.com/uk/learners/fe-and-college-students/supporting-fe-students-parents-covid-19/results-day-support-2020.html

Following yesterday's announcement by Pearson about BTEC qualifications, the Guernsey College of Further Education team will be at Coutanchez Campus from 10am on the $20^{\rm th}$ August. If you are expecting BTEC results, please go in and see them.

New results process announced for exams* 17th August 2020:

Exam regulator Ofqual announced on Monday 17th August that students should be awarded grades based on their centre assessment - that is, the grade their school or college estimated was the grade they would most likely have achieved in their exam - or the grade adjusted by Ofqual, whichever is higher. Ofqual will inform UCAS directly where a student's results have gone up as a result.









The Sixth Form Centre emailed students on the 17th August to explain the changes and will endeavour to send them their centre assessed grades as soon as possible. The Guernsey College of Further Education will also contact any students whose grades change as a result of Monday's announcement.

If you have changed your mind about your university offer, follow the <u>UCAS advice</u> about the options to enter Clearing or contact a Careers Adviser at <u>careersguernsey@gov.gg</u> or T: 706565.

If you haven't previously applied but <u>now</u> want to apply to university you will need to register through <u>UCAS Clearing service</u> and check the courses which still have vacancies to see whether this is an option for you. There may be other options to consider for studying a degree, depending on your subject choice. These can include local course options, Open University, other distance learning degree courses or study abroad. Results not what you were expecting?

If you have applied to university and you do not meet the conditions of any offers you are holding, you can use the <u>UCAS Clearing service</u>. Log in to <u>UCAS Track</u> to check your status and if you are eligible to enter Clearing.

UCAS are offering a new service this year called <u>Clearing Plus</u> (which replaces the direct contact service) where if you find yourself in clearing UCAS can personally match you to courses you may be interested in, using what they know about you from your application and what universities and colleges are looking for in a student.

If you want to apply for something different you can still find courses available in <u>UCAS Clearing service</u> by using the search tool.

If your results are higher than you were expecting and you meet or exceed the conditions of your firm choice, you may be eligible to use the <u>UCAS</u> <u>Adjustment Service</u> to find an alternative course.
