Updated results process for BTECs: *19th August 2020

Following Ofqual's announcement that A-Level and GCSE students are to receive Centre Assessment Grades, Pearson (the body which administers BTEC) qualifications has decided to apply Ofqual's principles for students receiving BTECs this summer. This means Centre Assessment Grades will apply across all teacher assessed internal units and examined grades that students were unable to sit.

Pearson will be regrading all the following BTECs-BTEC Level 3 Nationals (2010 QCF and 2016 RQF), BTEC Level 1/2 Tech Awards, BTEC Level 2 Technicals and BTEC Level 1/2 Firsts. Pearson are reassuring students that no grades will go down as part of this review.

Pearson have asked Schools and Colleges not to issue any BTEC Level 1 & 2 results on the 20th August as these will be reviewed and where appropriate regraded. https://www.pearson.com/uk/learners/fe-and-college-students/supporting-festudents-parents-covid-19/results-day-support-2020.html

Following yesterday's announcement by Pearson about BTEC qualifications, the Guernsey College of Further Education team will be at Coutanchez Campus from 10am on the 20th August. If you are expecting BTEC results, please go in and see them.

New results process announced for GCSE exams* 17th August 2020:

Exam regulator Ofqual announced on Monday 17th August that students should be awarded grades based on their centre assessment - that is, the grade their school or college estimated was the grade they would most likely have achieved in their exam - or the grade adjusted by Ofqual, whichever is higher.









Earlier on Monday, the Committee *for* Education, Sport & Culture (States of Guernsey) announced that Year 11 students who have been offered course places at the Sixth Form Centre or The Guernsey College of Further Education will be able to progress on to their chosen areas of study irrespective of their final issued grades from the national bodies.
